This summer, some of the events we are bringing back include the Adventure Challenge for kids, the Cardboard Boat Regatta, Camping Under the Stars, and 2 additional dates to the popular Tots in the Park series.

We also have a wide variety of fun programs planned for people of all ages. Whether you enjoy summer camp, pickleball, playing cards, listening to live music, exercising at the Fitness Center, or exercising your dog at the Happy Tails Dog Park, there is something for everyone throughout the pages of this program guide. In addition to the annual Labor Day festival, the new amphitheater will be the home for our summer concert series as well as other live performances.

On behalf of all of us here at the Buffalo Grove Park District, I hope you and your family have a wonderful summer and enjoy the beautiful parks that we have here in Buffalo Grove.





Registration Information



Proof of Residency

You must provide proof of residency the first time you register, in order to receive Buffalo Grove Park District in-district rates. Once you are in our system, you will not need to prove residency again unless your address changes. The only acceptable forms of proof include a valid driver's license or state identification card, or a current electric, gas, water, or garbage bill.

Registration Information

The Park District's registration process was developed to permit fair access to Park District programs and services for all of our residents.

- Complete your registration form(s), including second-choice programs and signature. Unsigned forms or incorrect payments will delay the registration process.
- Make sure that all program codes indicate the classes you want. If the code is incorrect, it may delay your registration.

Waitlists

Waitlists are automatically created when we have more registrations for a program than we have space. Your receipt will indicate if you are registered for a program or on the waitlist. We will process refunds once we are certain that we cannot find an opening for you.

Second-Choice Programs

Selecting a second choice increases the likelihood of getting into a program. Please pay the total of the highest fees. If your payment is less than the necessary total, your registration cannot be processed. If the program you want is full, we will place you in your second-choice program. If both programs are full, you will be placed on a waitlist for your first-choice program and your fee will be refunded.

Refunds

- Full refunds will be issued for any program canceled by the Park District.
- Participants may request refunds for programs up to 5 business days before the program's first meeting. In athletic programs and leagues, the program is considered to begin with its first practice.
- Refunds received with less than 5 business days' notice will be issued only for a medical problem when accompanied by a doctor's note.
- Refunds for trips and contractual workshops will be issued only if the spot can be filled from the waitlist.
- Once a program has ended, a refund will not be issued.
- A \$5 administration fee will be charged against refunds, including medical problems, to cover clerical and administrative costs.
 There are no administrative fees charged when a program is canceled by the Park District
- Fees paid by credit cards will be refunded through charge account credits. All other payment types will be refunded by check.
- If you register online and would like to withdraw, please complete a registration change form and email it to registrar@ bgparks.org, or fax it to 847.459.5741.
- Refund processing takes 2 weeks.

Senior Discount

In-district residents aged 62 and over are entitled to a 20% discount on recreation opportunities through the Park District except contractual programs and trips. Programs marked with this symbol symbol indicates that the program is eligible for the 20% discounted fee. This applies only to programs listed in the Adult Programs, Adult Sports, and Fitness and Wellness sections. All eligible programs in the Club 50 sections already have the discount applied.

Receipts

A confirmation of registration will be sent to you electronically if an email address has been provided. If not, a receipt will be mailed to the address on the registration form. The Buffalo Grove Park District will reissue past receipts when a receipt request form is completed. There is a \$5 fee per request. Receipt request forms are available on our website or at the Alcott Center. Once the fee is paid and the form is completed, please allow 5 days for processing.

Program Changes & Cancellations

- Programs are sometimes canceled or altered due to low registration, changes in staff, or facility availability.
- If your receipt indicates a program has been canceled or altered, please contact the Park District right away at 847.850.2100. We may be able to transfer your registration to another program of your choice.
- You are entitled to a full refund for a program that has been canceled by the Park District.

Park District Advantages

If you live within the boundaries of the Buffalo Grove Park District, you are entitled to:

- Registration for limited programs before they are opened to those who live out-of-district.
- Pre-registration for certain continuing programs.
- In-district rates for all programs.

The boundaries of the Buffalo Grove Park District and the Village of Buffalo Grove are not exactly the same. Some neighborhoods at the edges of Wheeling and Arlington Heights are in the Buffalo Grove Park District boundary. Other neighborhoods within the Village of Buffalo Grove are outside the Park District. If you are not certain whether you qualify as a resident of the District, please check your property tax bill, or contact our registration office at 847.850.2100.

Out-of-District Fair Share Fees

Those who live within the boundaries of the Buffalo Grove Park District make significant contributions to the operation of the agency through their property taxes. This contribution is beyond the fees they pay for programs and services. The fair share fee policy was adopted by the Park District's Board of Commissioners to equalize this financial burden. Fair share fees will be 25% more than the in-district fee up to a maximum of \$100.

General Information

Americans with Disabilities Act

The Buffalo Grove Park District will comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), which prohibits discrimination in the provision of programs, services, or activities to individuals with disabilities. Illinois Relay Center

The Buffalo Grove Park District encourages people who have hearing or speech impairments to use the Illinois Relay Center if they wish to call the Park District. The service is available at no cost to those using a TDD or TTY.

If you use a TDD or TTY and want to call the Park District or someone who uses a standard telephone, the communications assistant will voice your typed words to the person using a standard telephone and type the standard phone users words to you.

To use this service:

- 1. Dial 7-1-1 or 800.526.0844.
- When the Communications Assistant answers, type the telephone number of the person you want to call.
- When the person answers, proceed as you would with a regular TTY call. Direct your conversation to the person you are calling, not to the communications assistant.
- 4. Type "GA" when you are ready for the other person to respond. When you are finished with your conversation, end the call by typing "GA" or "SK"(stop keying), giving the person you are calling an opportunity to continue or end the call.

Photo Disclaimer

Registrants and participants of programs and special events permit the Buffalo Grove Park District to take photos and videos of themselves and their children for publication in the program guide, website, and additional uses as the Park District deems necessary unless the registrant or participant expressively files with the Park District a written objection as to photos or videos of themselves and/or their children.

Facilities

All facilities participants are expected to follow the rules of the facilities. Specialty areas of the facilities (example: Fitness Center and the pools) have posted signs stating special rules specific to that area. Disregard or abuse of facility rules may result in removal by staff or police from the facility for a designated length of time or permanently.

Warning of Risk

Recreational activities/programs are intended to challenge and engage the physical, mental, and emotional resources of each participant. Despite careful and proper preparation, instruction, medical advice, conditioning, and equipment, there is still a risk of serious injury when participating in any recreational activity/program. Understandably, not all hazards and dangers can be foreseen. Depending on the particular activity, participants must understand that certain risks, dangers, and injuries due to inclement weather, slipping, falling, poor skill level or conditioning, carelessness, horseplay, unsportsmanlike conduct, premises defects, inadequate or defective equipment, inadequate supervision, instruction, or officiating, and all other circumstances inherent to indoor and outdoor recreational activities/programs exist. In this regard, it must be recognized that it is impossible for the Buffalo Grove Park District to guarantee absolute safety.

Accident Insurance

The Park District does not carry medical or accident insurance for program participants. Participants should review their personal insurance before registering for Park District programs to be certain of adequate coverage.

Behavior Policy

Part of the mission of the Buffalo Grove Park District is to provide safe and wholesome programs, parks, and facilities for our residents and guests. The behavior policy has been established to help fulfill this mission. We ask all staff, volunteers, participants, and spectators to help us in our effort to provide the best possible environment to enjoy our recreation activities. Smoking

Smoking is not allowed on Park District property. This includes electronic cigarettes (e-cigs or e-cigarettes), personal vaporizers (PV), or electronic nicotine delivery systems (ENDS), or any other device that simulates tobacco smoking by producing an aerosol that resembles smoke. This includes all parks, facilities, buildings, athletic fields, spectator/viewing areas, and parking lots. Thank you for your cooperation.

Park Hours

Unless otherwise posted, all lighted parks close at 11 pm and non-lighted parks close at 10 pm. All parks open at 6 am.

Pickleball & Tennis Courts

The Buffalo Grove Park District has 12 lighted pickleball courts, and 26 tennis courts, including lighted tennis courts at Emmerich, Kilmer, Willow Stream, and Woodland Parks. Due to inconsistencies in seasonal weather conditions, tennis courts, nets, and lights remain open and operational all year long.

Light Operation:

- Turn lights on by pressing the button near the entrance gate. Once turned on, the lights will remain illuminated for approximately 60 minutes.
- After 50 minutes a strobe light will flash.
- Once the light flashes, press the button again for an additional 60 minutes.
- Once lights turn off, it will take approximately 15 20 minutes to re-light.
- All courts are playable until 10:30 pm.
- Please report any vandalism or switch problems by calling Tim Howe at 847.850.2163.

Observers

Observers of programs are also expected to behave appropriately. Parents, friends, and any other observer are held to the same standards of behavior as participants. If inappropriate behavior of a program observer is reported or observed by a staff person, the observer will be asked to leave by staff or police if necessary.

Tree Memorial Program

If you would like to commemorate a date, person, event, or organization, you may arrange to have a tree of your choice planted in your favorite park. The Park District recognizes tree memorial donations with plaques at the Alcott Center. The Park District will consult families or individuals on the tree species and potential location. The Park District will complete all installations. All donations are tax-deductible. A brochure on the Living Tree Memorial program is available at the Alcott Center.

Camp Staff

All Buffalo Grove Park District summer camps have an on-site supervisor to encourage leadership and guidance for each of our unique camps. Many of the previous summer camp supervisors will also be back, full of fresh ideas and renewed commitment. All summer camp staff complete a thorough orientation process that incorporates safety, creativity, team building, and daily activity planning. All camp supervisors are certified in National Safety Council first aid, CPR, and AED.

Camp Site Locations

In addition to using some of our own facilities, through cooperative arrangements with School Districts 21, 96, and 102, we strive to provide the best facilities for our summer day camps. Due to capital improvement projects at the various school districts, all camp locations are subject to change.

Transportation

The Buffalo Grove Park District does not provide daily transportation to or from camp, however we do utilize a school bus service for swimming and our many fun field trips.

Registration Information

The registration deadline is 1 week prior to the first day of each session for all camps, as well as Post Summer Camp field trips. All registrations received after those dates will need supervisor approval if spaces are available.

Establishing Residency & Household Account

Newly created accounts are flagged as out-of-district until proof of indistrict residency is established. Visit our website at baparks.org and click on "Program Registration" at the bottom of the page to begin the process of creating your account.

You must provide proof of residency at the Alcott Center to receive in-district registration access. The only acceptable forms of proof include a valid driver's license or state identification card, or a current electric, gas, water, or garbage bill. Refunds

Refund requests received on or before 1 week prior to the first day of camp session will be issued, minus the nonrefundable \$50 deposit and a \$5 administrative fee. Refund requests received after those dates will only be issued when accompanied by a current doctor's note. Refund requests for Post Summer Adventure received on or before 1 week prior to the first day will receive a full refund, minus a \$5 administrative fee. Refund requests after the first day will receive a 50% refund.

Waitlis

Campers can be on no more than 2 waitlists per session. Each child can be enrolled in one camp and one waitlist per session, or they can be on 2 waitlists and not be currently enrolled in a camp. When registering for camp, if the camp is full, to get onto any camp waitlist, use code #360499.

Transfers

- ▶ In-district residents age 62 and older receive a 20% discount on their season pass.
- ▶ No refunds will be issued for pool passes.

Potawatomi Pathways

Grade: Preschool - 5

This program emphasizes the connection between history and the environment. Students view reproduction Potawatomi artifacts while learning about Native American houses, food, and clothing. Additional options include a memory game, folktale, or trading post activity.

A Student's Life

Grade: 1 - 2

This presentation uses images and artifacts to show students what life was like 100 years ago. They explore one day in the life of a child - home, school, shopping, and having fun.

Tiny Traders

Grade: 1 - 2

Shop like the farmers did 125 years ago! First, students earn money from the dairy cow, gather eggs, and make a shopping list. Next, they shop in the General Store using their money and eggs to buy and barter for the things on their shopping list. This program teaches the difference between needs and wants and the link between work and money.

Buffalo Grove Then & Now

Grade: 1 - 5

Experience westward expansion into Illinois in the 1830s. Students start by brainstorming what pioneers needed to settle Buffalo Grove. Next, the museum educator opens a pioneer trunk filled with reproduction artifacts, demonstrating the use of each item and the need it filled. Finally, students make their own choices in a hands-on wagon-packing activity.

Invention vs Innovation

Grade: 3 - 5

Students learn about the power of invention by looking at 2 classic historymaking examples from the Museum's collection - cameras and telephones. They will then learn about innovation as they explore how both of these inventions changed over time and eventually merged into today's smartphones.

What Makes a Good Exhibit?

Grade: 3 - 5

Tired of looking at rainbow font? This program introduces students to the design behind good exhibits and signs. Using hands-on examples, they will discover that the way information is arranged visually is key to helping the reader understand their message.

Early Chicago

Grade: 3 - 5

Learn about the early history of Chicago - how it developed, why it grew, and the different ways in which Chicago and the suburbs are connected.

Archaeology (1)



Grade: 4 - 8

This exciting program introduces students to the history, science, and practice of archaeology! After viewing a presentation about archaeology principles and techniques, students put their knowledge to work by participating in a mock dig and analyzing the artifacts they uncover.




