Arrival and Dismissal

- Information about arrival and dismissal will communicated in the Principal's Messages at the beginning of the year.
- There are buses that transport students home at 2:30 and then again after clubs and activities.
- If a student participate in sports, parents do provide transportation home from practices and games. There is NO transportation home after games and practices.

A and B Days

- Students rotate their Exploratory and Spanish class.
- They will be assigned either an A or B day for Spanish. The Exploratory rotation will be the other day.
- A and B days alternate for all school days.
- A and B days are announced daily and posted around the school.

Exploratory Classes

- Students who are not enrolled in Band or Orchestra experience the following Exploratory classes during the year.
- Art, Music, TASOL (The Art and Science of Living)
- The classes change each Trimester.
- Students in Band or Orchestra do not participate in the classes above.

PE/Health

- Students have PE every day.
- Students are assigned to a health rotation.
- During the year, students go to health for a total of 3 rotations that last about 3 weeks long. During this time students do not report to PE.

Flex-40 minute period

- Students are assigned to a teacher for Flex. This is referred to as their base camp.
- During Flex students received Tier 1 support (extension or intervention) from any of their core teachers (Math, SS, Science, LA)
- Students also receive Tier 2 or 3 math or reading interventions.
- Students in special education receive their related services and resource support during Flex.

Flex Continued

- When students are not being pulled by their teachers, receiving intervention, or services, the students are working on activities focused on...
 - Reading: independent silent reading
 - Math- IXL
 - Self-paced and interest driven Flex Menu options.
 These options span all curricular areas.

8. You mentioned "teams". How do teams work?

Grade Level Teams

- Group of teachers responsible for a small group of students (100–125 students)
- Meet regularly to discuss programs, curriculum, students, cooperative plans
- Communication with parents; newsletters, phone calls, conferences, e-mail
- Students identify with smaller group; sense of community.
- Teachers know students well
- Students have classes with their team for SS, Math, Science, Language Arts
- Students have exploratory, Spanish, lunch, and PE with both teams

Extracurricular Activities

All clubs/activities, study halls, and sports will be advertised in the Daily Announcements and on the school website.

Students do not need to sign up or register for clubs. There are expectations to clubs with space constraints. These will be communicated in the daily announcements.

Students who access transportation to and from school will have transportation home after clubs.

Fees for Extracurricular Activities

Parents can prepay \$40 for activities at the beginning of the year.

Students enrolled in band and orchestra pay an additional \$20.

Students participating in soccer, basketball, volleyball or poms (dance team) pay an additional \$20.
