Welcome to Visitors

President Tepper welcomed members of the faculty, community, and press to the meeting. Megan Clarke led the Pledge of Allegiance. Mr. Tepper asked if anyone wished to address the Board. The following people spoke:

Mr. Tepper noted that Mrs. Sheridan did not receive any public comments via email.

Noting the absence of Mrs. Manka, Mr. Tepper appointed Mr. Burns secretary pro tem.

Approval of Minutes

September 2022

A motion was presented by Mrs. Klass and seconded by Mr. Burns to approve the minutes of September 6 & 20, 2022, as presented. All members present voted Aye; the motion carried.

Financial Statements

Mr. Hitcho presented the financial reports, noting that all reports were in order. He added the District made three investments in municipal bonds at an interest rate of 3.87% for 3 years. With no questions or comments forthcoming, Mr. Tepper directed the business office to place the following Financial Statements for the month of September 2022 appropriately on file in the business office: Treasurer's Report, Budget Reports, and Activity Report.

Board Reports

Finance Committee

Mr. Strezewski reported the Finance Committee reviewed the bills, the resolution for estimated amounts for 2022 tax levy, the budget timeline for 2023-24, and the FY2023 Capital Improvement Plan, and discussed a solar study at Twin Groves Middle School. Bids for the Capital Improvement Plan will be brought to the

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Board for consideration in November. Mr. Strezewski stated the committee recommended approval of the bills and Tax Levy Resolution on Consent Agenda.

Policy Committee

Mrs. Zarkowsky reported the Policy Committee reviewed Section 8 Community Relations and no changes were recommended.

Legislative Update

Mr. Tepper reported the IASB has created a search committee to seek a replacement for Dr. Bertrand and will survey the membership on values. Mr. Tepper stated that COSSBA now has 23 member states and held an Urban Board Alliance Symposium last week. The COSSBA conference will be held in April 2023.

Mr. Tepper added the IASB has reviewed and finalized proposed amendments to be considered at the Joint Annual Conference November 18-20, 2022.

ELC Update

Mrs. Klass stated how thrilled she is to host the Board meeting at the ELC and added how proud she is of the work they do. The ELC met on September 22, 2022, when they considered new hires and resignations, bills, and budget. She noted the ELC Parent Education series is phenomenal.

Thought Exchange Partnership Update

Mrs. Bird reported the second meeting of TEP was held October 13, 2022. Mr. Hanrahan presented on Social Emotional Learning. The next meeting will be on January 11, 2023.

Guiding Coalition on Interculturalism Update

Mrs. Zarkowsky reported the next meeting will be October 26, 2022.

Space/Facilities/Innovation Committee - None at this time.

Fall Lake Division Meeting

Mrs. Klass reported the Board attended the Fall Lake Division Meeting on October 12, 2022. Dr. Michael Karner, the superintendent of the Lake County Regional Office of Education, spoke; Ellyn Ross gave the District Report; and five members of District 96 received Board Leadership awards: Mrs. Zarkowsky, Mr. Burns, Mrs. Klass, Mr. Tepper, and Mr. Strezewski. A presentation on how to communicate with legislators and advocate for your district was also heard.

<u>Other</u>

Mrs. Sheridan reported the *Board Articulation Council Committee* (BACC) will meet in February 2023 for the first time in many years. Mr. Tepper noted a BACC representative will have to be named.

Administrative Reports

Exceptional Learners Collaborative and Special Education Update

Mrs. Dunne and Ms. Clarke provided an update on the relationship between KCSD96 special education and the ELC and introduced the team that works together, including Jennifer Dunne, Megan Clarke, Elizabeth Burgess, and Brooke Goldberg. The executive board consists of Renee Klass-KCSD96, Kate

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Harper-LPVSD103, and Terry Moons-ASHSD125. The governing board consists of Sean Carney, Kathryn Sheridan, Eric Twadell, and Scott Warren. Julie Schmidt, the outgoing governing board member, helped create the ELC, which opened July 1, 2015, serving districts 103, 125 and 96.

Mrs. Dunne reviewed the special education programs District 96 provides: Early Childhood for students 3-5 years old

- Structural Learning full-day program for Early Childhood and Kindergarten that fosters independence, expected behaviors and peer interaction
- Early Childhood Special Education half-day program serving students with IEPs
- Blended tuition-based program that blends regular education and special education students for a half-day of programming.

The ELC provides the Early Childhood Assessment Team (ECAT), which screens and evaluates students ages 3 – 5 for the Early Childhood programs, as well as students requesting early enrollment into Kindergarten.

In grades K – 8, District 96 offers numerous supports including:

- Structured at Ivy Hall and Twin Groves for grades 1 8
- Guided Functional Learning with Districts 102 and 103 (only at Ivy Hall for grades 3 5)
- Individualized Learning Community (ILC) providing direct instruction at Ivy Hall, Woodlawn and Twin Groves
- Instructional and Resource supports provided at every building; co-taught math and literacy at the middle schools

The ELC supports District 96 with assistive technology and provides positions that are difficult to fill. These position services are provided to the member districts and sold to other districts seeking the services. District 96 funds the ELC 28.47%, with District 125 being the largest purchaser of services. Additional services provided by the ELC include professional development, TEACCH Training, parent training, and family events. The ELC West just opened August 2022, serving students 18 – 22 years old in vocational tasks and life skills.

Mrs. Klass reiterated how proud she is of the ELC. Raising a child with significant disabilities herself, she has seen a lot of programs over the years. The ELC provides exceptional service and is highly sought-after. She added how thankful she is to Mrs. Schmidt for spearheading the creation of the ELC.
