

Dr. Nancy Frey, keynote speaker

Nancy Frey, Ph.D., is a professor of literacy in the School of Teacher Education at San Diego State University. She is the recipient of the 2008 Early Career Achievement Award from the National Reading Conference and a Christa McAuliffe Award for excellence in teacher education from the American Association of

State Colleges and Universities.

Nancy has been published in a number of publications and is the coauthor of three books, including *Checking for Understanding: Formative* Assessment Techniques for Your Classroom.

She teaches a variety of courses in SDSU's teacher-credentialing program on elementary and secondary reading instruction and literacy in content areas. Nancy also teaches classes at Health Sciences High and Middle College in San Diego.

Fine Arts teachers will work with Liz Lerman on the Critical Response Process, a widely acclaimed method to enhance collaboration, critical thinking, communication and creativity skills through facilitated dialogue between artists, peers, and audiences. The Process helps deepen dialogue between artists and audiences; it has enhanced learning between teachers and students. By extension it has proven valuable for all kinds of creative endeavors, work situations, and collaborative relationships within and beyond the arts, from kindergartens to corporations.

Liz Lerman is a choreographer, performer, writer, educator, and speaker. Described by the *Washington Post* as "the source of an epochal revolution in the scope and purposes of dance art," her dance/theater works have been seen throughout the United States and abroad. Her aesthetic approach spans the range from abstract to personal to political. Liz Lerman is a recipient of a MacArthur Genius Grant.
