The Willow Grove Bus Book



Inside this book are reminders about expected behaviors on the bus.



It is a privilege to ride the Willow Grove Bus. Any Willow Grove student can ride the bus by following the bus safety rules.

It is important to always remember the Willow Grove Bears That Care Pledge. Everyone will have a safe and happy ride if we follow our pledge.







We show kindness on the bus! Kind and caring words and actions are expected.





When you get on the bus, find a seat, and sit down quickly. We show kindness by always letting anyone sit next to us. The bus will move as soon as everyone is ready for a safe ride.





Showing kindness also means we keep our hands and feet to ourselves. We don't touch others or their things.





We are responsible on the bus! When we are responsible we make choices that keep ourselves and everyone safe.





We must stay seated on the bus. Never stand or change seats. Our whole body and belongings should be in the seat area and not in the aisle of the bus. This keeps us safe.





Emergency doors and windows are for emergencies only. Never touch these unless the bus driver gives you special directions.



Keep your hands and head inside the bus. Never throw anything in the bus or out of the bus window.



We show respect on the bus!
Showing respect means to think about others and how they feel.
When you respect someone you treat them kindly and use good manners.





Listen to your bus driver and always follow directions. The driver may need your attention before, during, or after your trip.







The bus driver must hear important outdoor sounds to be safe. Use a Level 2 voice (table talk) or lower inside the bus and a Level 0 (no talking) when the bus stops at railroad crossings.



The bus must be kept clean and safe. No candy, food, or drinks are to be eaten on the bus. This keeps everyone safe and shows respect to our driver.





Tell the driver if you ever have a problem on the bus. Your parent, teacher, or any Willow Grove adult are other people who can help you.

Let's Learn Buddy's Bus Chant! Buddy has a special way of remembering some of our bus rules!

Stay in my seat, Hands to self, Listen to my driver, That's how I'll help!



Don't forget to ask yourself, am I showing kindness, responsibility, and respect? If the answer is yes, GREAT job!
